Introduction

By the grace of God, the Almanac of the CSI has once again been published and adapted to serve our Diaspora Diocese. This year, the motto selected for the Diocese is "Move Forward," inspired by Psalm 71:16.

Special days of observance and worship have been identified for the USA and Canada and included in the Almanac for your use. We aim to glorify God through our acts of worship as we remember the nations and communities we serve. We are indebted to give back through our prayers and supplications. May God's guidance will help us as we embrace the rich heritage of the Church of South India. As we embrace the theme of "Move Forward," let us find strength in God and continue to proclaim His righteousness. May this Almanac inspire us to live out our faith with renewed purpose and dedication, guiding us in our journey with unity and devotion.

The themes and lessons for Sundays and other Feast / Commemoration days are adopted from the Third cycle (Year C) of the revised three cycled common Lectionary prepared by the "Worship and Mission Commission" of the Communion of Churches in India (Joint Council of the CSI, CNI and the Mar Thoma Church). The collects are prepared by the CSI Liturgy Committee and follow the lectionary themes.

The readings for weekdays follow the First Cycle (Year A) of Daily Reading prepared by the CSI Synod Liturgy Committee to cover the Old Testament once in three years and the New Testament twice in three years. A table of Psalms for daily reading is also provided. Themes and prayers for the Prayer Octave for Christian Unity 2025 prepared by the World Council of Churches are also provided to encourage the local congregations to join the worldwide Church in praying, experiencing, and anticipating unity. The reflective meditations are published in book form and the same will also be available on the CSI website, csisynod.com.
